

KEEP SAFE FROM COVID-19

CAMPGROUNDS

Protect Your Staff

- Check worker temperatures every day.
- Don't let Employees work when ill. Make sure they stay home for at least 3 days after symptoms disappear.
- Emphasise the importance of handwashing with staff and install handwash stations.
- Staff should wear gloves when opening envelopes with camp reservation slips & checks/cash.
- Staff should wear PPE (face covering and gloves) when cleaning.
- Consider closing communal showers due to multiple users and difficulty cleaning more frequently.

Protect Your Campers

- Remind campers to recreate closer to home and recreate responsibly.
- Encourage campers to set up their own handwash stations at their own campsites
- Promote guests staying for longer periods of time to prevent sites being used by multiple guests.
- Increase physical distance between campsites by reduce number
- Promote use of independent camping units that have private bathroom and hand washing facilities.
- Group camping should be discouraged.

Environmental Controls & Disinfection Guidelines

- Install "hands free" water fixtures on common water access faucets.
- Consider installing "hands free" equipment (arm or foot pulls) on doors to restrooms, privies and showers.
- Close non-essential communal areas like arcades, pavillions, playgrounds, communal bonfire rings, and beaches.
- Increase the frequency of cleaning and sanitizing toilet facilities and other communal areas. Disinfect multi-touch surfaces frequently (door knobs, railings)
- Use 1/3 C bleach to 1 gallon water to make up disinfecting solution. Use in a spray or in your sanitizing bucket.
- Post sign to limit # of people allowed in necessary common areas such as fish cleaning station and the camp store.
