Ordinance Amendment

Under Committee reports

Supervisor Kelley reported that he had received a few phone calls from concerned citizens about the town’s purchase of new Dominion Voting Machines.

Clerk Trudell explained the old machines are 16 years old and are only supported through 2022 and because of current law; it is required in Wisconsin to have paper ballots and voting machines available on Election Day.

Trudell explained that she coordinated a demonstration meeting between the voting machine vendors and town clerks in July of 2020. The town clerks brought the information back to their town boards. All 8 towns signed the contracts and ordered new machines in September and October of 2020. Trudell explained that shortly after the November Elections there was wide spread media and internet rumors about the Dominion Voting Machines resulting in massive lawsuits.

County Board Chair Bomberg spoke encouraging all Supervisor’s to do their own research on the new election machines and try to attend any town voter machine demonstrations.

County Board Chair Bomberg wished Larry Dzekute Happy Birthday on February 3rd and Ed Kelley Happy Birthday March 29. She said Larry has served the County for 24years and Ed has served the County for 49 years totaling 73 years.
